- Hortiservices have now finished landscaping our thanks to the entire team for an excellent job. The remaining works are to build the connecting path from the rainwater harvesting shelter to the main path, to shape the mound and to install a barrier on the dipping deck and safety fencing around the pond. These will be done as soon as budget allows. Additional money has already been found to increase the length of the gravel path and install a ramp to the dipping deck thus allowing full accessibility. DPC to agree additional costs.
- Warning signs are in place around the pond, along with temporary barrier fencing. We will
  install wooden fencing (similar to that around the nectar garden) around the pond until the
  plants have grown, after which a decision will be made whether to fence the pond permanently.
   DPC to discuss and agree costs for installing warning signs and fencing pond.
- Solar lighting has been put up at the bike and rainwater harvesting shelter and will be dimmed by a filter as they are currently too bright.
- We are applying to Cambridge Water to bring mains water on site application fee is £70 (with no obligation to proceed). **DPC to discuss and agree**.

- Sadly no progress yet to connect the Elms close footpath to the eastern entrance. We are in
  dispute with the contractor and have requested assistance from County Council Highways in
  resolving the matter. We have also requested BT/Openreach to quote for repositioning the
  telegraph pole.
